A storyteller with over two decades performing experience with diverse audiences throughout the world, Morgan divides her time between teaching story-telling to Early Childhood Professionals and researching and performing traditional tales to celebrate humanity. Morgan welcomes suggestions from teachers to address curriculum outcomes in her concerts. Her extensive repertoire allows her to draw on traditional world stories and present them in an enter-

taining format. Morgan is also an accomplished musician and her presentations are both visually and aurally exciting. 'As well as playing a vital role in the cognitive, emotional and social development of children, folktales are a medium for teaching life lessons and passing on cultural traditions and values. Creating confident and compassionate communicators can be achieved at any educational level through the implementation of regular storytelling sessions.'

Storytelling Based Arts Residencies with Roman Schatz

PD Workshops for Early Childhood and Elementary Teachers

Morgan is the author of five storytelling handbooks suitable as teaching resources for Primary School and Early Childhood teachers. These books can be purchased independently or as part of her oral literature PD workshops. They are tailored to the specific requirements of teachers and have a general focus on teaching across the curriculum, through the medium of raps, rhymes, songs and stories. PD can take the form of one hour seminars through to day long workshops, according to the preferences of the school.
