She welcomes suggestions from teachers to address specific curriculum outcomes in her concerts. Her extensive repertoire allows her to draw on traditional world stories and present them in an entertaining format. Morgan is also an accomplished musician and her presentations are both visually and aurally exciting.

Morgan is the author of four storytelling handbooks for early childhood educators and offers tailored Professional Development workshops. In



collaboration with her husband, artist and photographer Roman Schatz, they also offer a series of workshops
